Ram Temple Trust broadens social representation within its structure

The restructure of the Shri Ram Janmabhoomi Teerth Kshetra Trust, announced on Wednesday, has not only expanded its membership but also reflects a broader social representation within its structure.

According to a senior RSS functionary, while maintaining the Trust's core identity and

the saint community's central role in decision-making, it now also includes representatives from women, backward classes, Dalits, and the legal field. This is being seen as a sign of the Trust's expanding role and responsibilities in response to changing times.

The Trust's most significant new identity has emerged in the form of its first female trustee. The appointment of Nirmala Yadav of Shikohabad ensures female participation

in the temple's top management for the first time. This is not just a matter of female representation, but also of the Yadav community, or backward class. Thus, a single appointment reveals two important dimensions of social representation.

Dalit representation already exists within the Trust. Dr Krishna Mohan's presence has underscored the message of social inclusion, from the temple movement to the Trust's structure. Now, with the addition of women and backward class representation, the Trust's social landscape appears to be expanding further.

Another important aspect of the new structure is legal and professional experience. The inclusion of senior Ayodhya advocate Madan Mohan Pandey alongside senior advocate K. Parasaran indicates that expertise in legal and administrative matters related to the temple is also being valued.

New CEO Jeetendra Mishra joins Ram Temple Trust meeting:

Ayodhya: Newly-appointed Chief Executive Officer (CEO), Air Marshal (Retd) Jeetendra Mishra, attended the first meeting with the Shri Ram Janmabhoomi Teerth Kshetra Trust members on Thursday.

The meeting, held at the Shri Ram Janmabhoomi Kshetra office near the workshop at Ramghat, discussed the Trust's new administrative system. After the meeting, the CEO told the media: "We introduced ourselves in the meeting today and discussed many issues. We will have many more meetings in the future so that I understand the work here completely and then only I will take charge."

"I am very fortunate to have the opportunity to serve Lord Shri Ram and Ram devotees," he said.

Newly-appointed trustee Madan Mohan Pandey said discussions were held on different aspects including the organisation and smooth function of the Ram temple. Responsibilities had not yet been assigned.

Former Air Marshal Jeetendra Mishra, General Secretary Govind Devgiri, Treasurer Mahesh Bhagchand, Trustee Madan Mohan Pandey along with other Trust members officers and employees associated with the accounting system were present in the meeting.

Kaushambi firecracker factory owner's son arrested after encounter; death toll reaches 14

After father, Naushad, now Adil, the son of the owner of an illegal firecracker factory in Kaushambi, was arrested after a brief encounter by police on Thursday.

Adil was shot in both legs and admitted to the district hospital. According to police, they surrounded Adil (20) and attempted to stop him. But Adil turned his bike and tried to flee. The bike skidded. He opened fire on the police, firing two rounds. He was shot in the retaliatory fire. Police admitted him to the district hospital.

Police said they recovered an illegal 315-bore pistol, live cartridges, and three spent shells from Adil. His bike was

also seized.

Meanwhile, the firecracker factory explosion has so far claimed the lives of 14 people, including nine children. While 11 died on the day of the explosion, the other 3 succumbed during the treatment.

On an early Tuesday morning, police arrested Adil's father and factory owner, Naushad (50), after an encounter. He was trying to flee the city. Furthermore, Adil's house was demolished by bulldozers on Tuesday night.

According to the police, Adil admitted his crime during interrogation. He revealed that he and his associates manufactured illegal firecrackers and explosives to earn money.

A warehouse near the Mahmudpur Manuri Power House was used for this purpose.

UP floods: 32 districts affected, 18 killed in rain-related incidents

More than 18 people have lost their lives in rain-related incidents across Uttar Pradesh in the past 24 hours, most of them due to house and wall collapses, as incessant rainfall continues to batter the state.

Rising water levels in several rivers have led to waterlogging in around 32

districts, with 22 of them severely affected, according to the Relief Commissioner's office.

The swollen Mandakani River in Chitrakoot, which has been affecting several districts in Madhya Pradesh and hilly areas amid continuous rainfall, rose by another 2.5 metres on Thursday after its water level had fallen below the danger mark. The rise has affected around 36 villages.

Teams from the Provincial Armed Constabulary (PAC) and the district administration have rescued around 150 people from flood-affected areas along the Mandakani. Food, relief supplies and medical assistance have also been provided to those affected by the flooding.

Due to excessive rainfall, Prayagraj is also witnessing a sudden rise in the water levels of the Ganga and Yamuna rivers, while the Sharda river in Lakhimpur Kheri is flowing 32 centimetres above the danger mark.

Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath conducted an aerial survey of flood-affected areas in Farrukhabad on Thursday to assess the situation.

Amid the continuing heavy rainfall and flood-like conditions in Chitrakoot, the district administration has declared a holiday for schools up to Class 12. Similar school closures have been announced in Varanasi, Chandauli, Sonbhadra and Ballia in view of the worsening weather conditions.

PM Modi speaks to Varanasi DM on flood situation

Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Member of Parliament from Varanasi, spoke with District Magistrate Satyendra Kumar on Thursday via telephone to obtain detailed information on the flood situation in the constituency.

PM received information from the District Magistrate regarding the Ganga water level and the arrangements being made for flood-affected people in relief camps.

He directed that efforts be made on a war footing to provide relief to flood-affected people, ensuring that all necessary facilities are immediately available to them.

PM asked the District Magistrate to make immediate arrangements for relief material in areas with additional need and expedite the delivery of relief to the affected people.

He directed to maintain constant vigilance on the flood situation and relief operations and to provide immediate relief to the



affected people.

According to the Central Water Commission, the water level at the Ganga gauge at Rajghat in Varanasi was recorded at 70.54 meters on Thursday, 0.278 meters above the warning level of 70.262 meters.

The water level is rising at a rate of 2 centimetres per hour. According to the commission, the danger mark of the Ganga is 71.262 meters, and the highest flood level (HFL) is 73.901 meters.

Mayawati sacks Akash Anand as chief coordinator, cites political immaturity

Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP) supreme Mayawati stripped her nephew, Akash Anand, from the post of Chief National Coordinator of the party. She vowed to keep him away from any major party responsibilities.

This is the third time that Akash Anand has been removed from the post of Chief National Coordinator. He was earlier removed and even expelled from the party twice along with his father-in-law, Ashok Sidharth. Calling him politically immature, her aunt said he needs further maturity to protect the party from potential electoral losses due to Opposition parties using tactics like *Sama*, *Daam*, *Danda*, *Bhed*.<Narrating the

principles of party founder the late Kanshi Ram, the BSP chief said he had allowed his family to participate only in party work and was against them contesting elections or holding positions. Mayawati, who held a national executive meeting at the party office in Lucknow on Thursday, took several important decisions. For the first time, Ishaan, Akash Anand's younger brother, attended the meeting. He arrived with Mayawati and his father, Anand Kumar, donning a BSP turban. Ishaan had previously attended the party office with his brother, Akash Anand, on Mayawati's birthday in 2024. Yukesh Singh, son of the late BSP MLA Umashankar Singh, also attended the meeting but Akash Anand was conspicuously absent.

Assam Congress ends alliance with Akhil Gogoi's Raijor Dal

The Assam Congress on Thursday formally ended its political alliance with the Akhil Gogoi-led Raijor Dal, accusing the regional party of repeatedly violating the norms and principles governing the opposition alliance.

The decision, which takes immediate effect, was taken on the direction of Assam Pradesh Congress Committee (APCC) president and Deputy Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha Gaurav Gogoi.

An organisational circular announcing the decision was issued by APCC General Secretary (Organisation) Ramanna Baruah.



The Congress said the alliance was formed ahead of the Lok Sabha and Assembly elections to bring together regional and Left parties, including the Raijor Dal, with the aim of presenting a united opposition against what it described as communal forces.

However, the party alleged that Raijor Dal leaders repeatedly targeted the Congress during

the alliance period through what it termed malicious propaganda and personal attacks.

The Congress also accused the regional party's leadership of making "baseless, unwarranted and derogatory" remarks against leaders of other parties within the opposition grouping.

According to the Congress,

repeated incidents weakened the basic understanding between the alliance partners, eventually making it untenable to continue political ties with the Raijor Dal.

The decision comes amid a sharp public exchange between the two parties in recent days. On Sunday, the APCC criticised remarks made by Akhil Gogoi and accused him of disregarding alliance discipline.

At a joint press conference, Assam Pradesh Mahila Congress president Mira Borthakur and APCC Media and Communication Department chairman Bedabrat Bora questioned Gogoi's conduct and warned him against allegedly acting as a "government agent".

Beyond the tiger, UP places habitats at heart of its ecotourism model

A child discovering butterflies in Ghazipur, a birder observing the Sarus across the wetlands of Mainpuri, or a visitor learning about the forest beyond a safari at Dudhwa reflect the different ways in which Uttar Pradesh is widening its wildlife tourism experience.

On National Wildlife Day, tomorrow, the tiger remains the state's most recognisable wildlife draw, but eco tourism planning is increasingly bringing birds, wetlands, forests and the habitats that sustain them into sharper focus. Nature trails, interpretation facilities, watchtowers, informative signage and habitat based circuits are being used to make wildlife travel more about understanding a landscape rather than simply

recording a sighting.

Over Rs 231 crore has been approved across 70 eco tourism projects between FY 2022 to 23 and FY 2025 to 26, covering forests, wetlands, wildlife areas, bird sanctuaries, lakes and other nature destinations across Uttar Pradesh.

UP Tourism and Culture Minister Jaiveer Singh said, "Under the leadership of Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath, our effort is to develop ecotourism in a way that protects the character of every landscape and helps visitors understand what they are seeing. Wildlife tourism should not end with a photograph or a sighting. Nature trails, interpretation, viewing spaces and species based circuits can build respect for habitats, encourage responsible travel and create opportunities for communities living around

them."

In the Terai, around Rs 8 crore has been taken up for signage linked to Dudhwa, including nearly Rs 5 crore on routes from Delhi NCR and Lucknow towards Dudhwa and over Rs 3 crore across Dudhwa Tiger Reserve, Kishanpur and Katarniaghat Wildlife Sanctuary. Besides visitor orientation, such signage can improve awareness about species, habitats and responsible behaviour inside sensitive forest landscapes.

At Ranipur Tiger Reserve in Chitrakoot, nearly Rs 14 crore has been taken up for development on tourism land near the reserve, giving Bundelkhand a stronger presence on a wildlife tourism map traditionally associated more closely with the Terai. At Sur Sarovar Bird Sanctuary in Agra, facilities include a natural trail, watchtower and informative

signage, while Haiderpur Wetland in Muzaffarnagar has a nature trail, nature camp and watchtower. Projects have also been taken up at Samaspur Bird Sanctuary in Raebareli, Sohagi Barwa Wildlife Sanctuary in Maharaiganj and Bakhira Lake in Sant Kabir Nagar.

More than Rs 4 crore has been taken up at Alwara Lake in Kaushambi, while over Rs 3.5 crore has been taken up at Dariyabganj Lake. Mamour Lake in Shamli and lake sites in Bareilly are also part of the expanding nature tourism network. "These landscapes offer a wildlife experience beyond large mammals, particularly during winter when migratory species such as greylag geese, northern pintails, ruddy shelducks and northern shovelers add another dimension to birding and wetland tourism.

Fresh Assam floods affect 25,000, death toll rises to 108

Assam is facing a fresh spell of flooding, with more than 25,000 people affected across seven districts and the death toll from flood-related incidents this year rising to 108 following the death of a woman in West Karbi Anglong, according to the latest assessment by the Assam State Disaster Management Authority (ASDMA). A senior official said on Thursday that floodwaters

have affected Goalpara, Sivasagar, Biswanath, Nagaon, Morigaon, West Karbi Anglong and Cachar districts.

Around 25,083 people in 155 villages are currently affected, while 13 relief camps have been set up to accommodate those displaced from their

homes. The floods have also caused considerable damage to agricultural land. According to ASDMA, around 6,477.31 hectares of crop area have been affected, raising concerns over the impact on the livelihoods of farming communities in the affected districts.
